for treatment, robust infrastructure, and a commitment to hygiene and cleanliness. The study also revealed challenges faced by medical tourists in Delhi, including difficulties in finding competent interpreters or translators, obtaining visas, securing insurance coverage, etc.

Applying an abduction logic approach, the study meticulously analysed the collected data using the constant comparison method. 



Fig 1. Summary of Survey Results

- India's Recognition as a Premier Destination for Medical Tourism: The responses to this question suggest that there is a balanced perception of India's position as a leading destination for medical tourism. While 30 respondents agree and 20 strongly agree, indicating a positive perception, 19 respondents strongly disagree, and 11 disagree, reflecting a negative or skeptical viewpoint.
- Evaluating the Expansion of Medical Tourism in India:
 Feedback on this matter indicates a varied outlook regarding the growth of medical tourism in India within the last five years. While 30 respondents strongly agree

- and 22 are neutral, indicating positive or neutral views, 18 strongly disagree and 12 disagree, suggesting a negative perception or scepticism.
- Satisfaction with Waiting Times at selected Hospitals:
 The responses highlight varying levels of satisfaction with waiting times for medical services at hospitals. A significant number of respondents (49) either strongly disagree or disagree, suggesting dissatisfaction. On the other hand, 28 respondents strongly agree, indicating a high level of satisfaction.
- Encountering administrative challenges during medical treatment: The survey question about encountering administrative challenges during medical treatment at the selected hospital generated responses that varied among participants. While some respondents did not face significant challenges (strongly disagree and disagree), others encountered moderate to significant administrative hurdles (agree and strongly agree).
